PROGRAM

This 3-credit course includes a one-week food, culture and culinary experience in southern France. During this trip you will visit a traditional French food market, enjoy hands on cooking lessons with a highly recognized French chef, savor a lovely assortment of French meals & products, and enjoy a culinary experience at a Michelin star restaurant. You will also visit producers of local French products such as goat cheese, olive oil, honey and/or wine, tour a historic city, and stay in the French countryside in a beautifully restored French manor.

LOCATION

The Languedoc-Roussillon region of France is the southernmost region of mainland France. It is bordered by five other regions of France, including Provence and Midi-Pyrenees, and the Mediterranean Sea. The beautiful countryside includes vast acres of vineyards, sunflowers, orchards and other agricultural products, as well as ancient towns and cities. The region has been an important winemaking center for centuries.

You will share a room with another student in a beautifully restored French manor home and spend one night in a hotel.

2017 PRICING

Undergraduate Program Fee: **\$2,507**

Graduate Program Fee: **\$2,755**

A \$350 nonrefundable deposit toward the total cost of the program is due at the time of application. The remaining fees are due no later than 45 days prior to departure. If you receive financial aid, you can defer payment until it disburses. Deferment decisions will be based on the amount of aid to be received.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Tuition for 3 credits, all in-country transportation, most meals, accommodations in a French country manor home & a hotel, cooking lessons, field trips & guided tours, guest lectures, international health insurance, and emergency medical assistance.

WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED

Round-trip airfare, some meals, additional personal travel, and personal expenses.



FINANCIAL AID

Most financial aid that you would receive on campus during the summer can be applied toward the cost of this study abroad program; however, all financial aid eligibility is determined by Student Financial Affairs. You must speak with your financial aid advisor to determine what aid can be applied to the cost of this program, including scholarships.
