PROGRAM

This program will explore food security in Trinidad by focusing on issues impacting availability, access, and awareness through a study tour of the country. Issues affecting food security will be examined through the lenses of production agriculture, governmental policies & initiatives, gender, youth development, and nutrition. The role of culture in the preceding issues will be explored. Activities in this program will involve collaborating with faculty and students from the University of the West Indies.

LOCATION

This program takes place in the St. Augustine area of Trinidad.

EXCURSIONS

Agricultural production tour; Nariva Swamp, "Down the islands"; various government ministries and facilities, Habitat for Humanity, the University of the West Indies, Chaguaramas.

HOUSING

Students will stay at Norma's Bed and Breakfast in Valsayn, Trinidad.

Graduate Program Fee: **\$2,091**

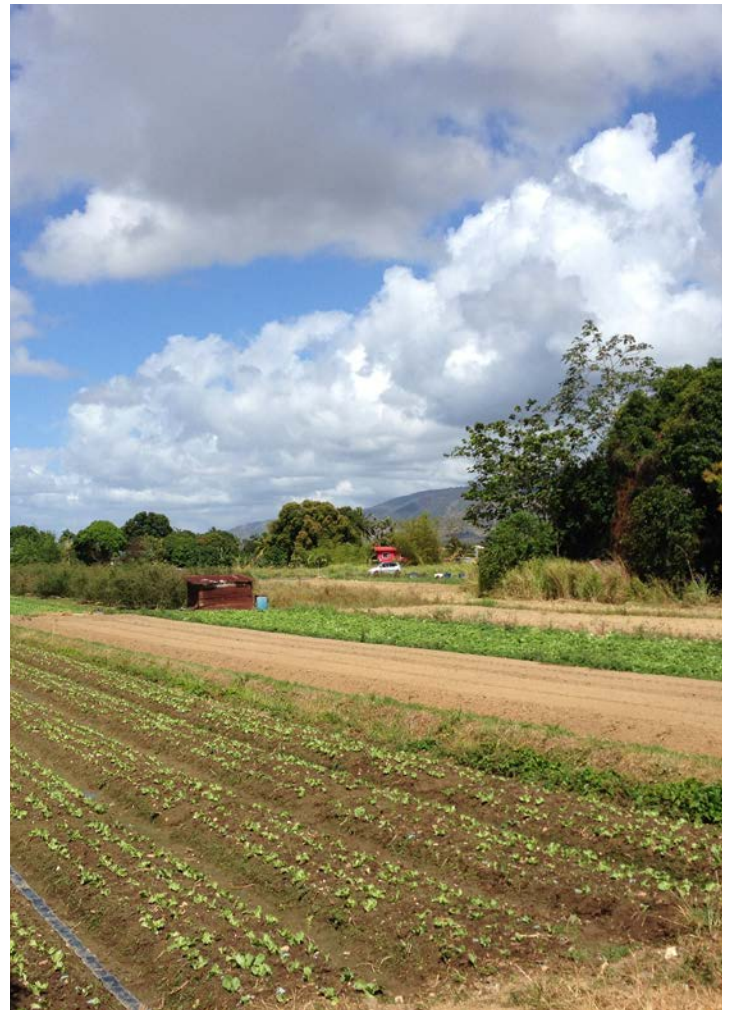
