PROGRAM

The primary goal of this program is to train students about current practices for establishing a vineyard and maintaining its health and productivity into the final quality of the grape. Students will learn about the cultural practices used in both grape production and winemaking, the importance of viticulture and wine sciences in the final quality of the wine, the grape varieties and their characteristics used in the production of wine, and the technology used in wine production. They will also learn the steps and equipment involved in basic winemaking as well as the importance of sensory evaluation of wines. Students will benefit from this experience by looking at and learning about vineyards and wineries in one of the well-known winegrape-growing countries.

LOCATION

The program will take place in Chile, specifically around the cities of Santiago and Santa Cruz.

EXCURSIONS

Program excursions will include visits to: Cerro San Cristobal in Santiago; the Universidad de Chile's Agroindustry and Enology Department; the Maipo Valley Grape Harvest Festival, OR a tour of Viña Undurraga in Maipo Valley; Vina Laura Hartwig; Lolo Heritage Village; Vina Santa Cruz; Vina Gangrejo; Museo de Colchagua; Vina Maquis; and Barrio Italia in Santiago.

HOUSING

Students will share double hotel rooms for the duration of the program. Single rooms are available for an additional fee.

2025 PRICING

Undergraduate Program Fee: \$3,531

Graduate Program Fee: \$3,587

A \$395 nonrefundable deposit toward the total cost of the program is due at the time of application. The remaining fees are due no later than 45 days prior to departure. If you receive financial aid, you can defer payment until it disburses. Deferment decisions will be based on the amount of aid to be received.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Tuition for 3 UF GPA credits, housing, international health insurance, and emergency medical assistance.

WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED

Round-trip airfare, most meals, additional personal travel, and personal expenses.
