PROGRAM

As the world becomes globalized, today's companies expect to hire graduates who can be effective in a global environment. In this course, students will learn about the different aspects and examples of cultural similarities and differences in a personal and professional setting, as well as the theories of intercultural communication and how to apply them in real world situations. Students will also learn about Irish culture and history from local experts and be able to develop an appreciation for the culture of their host country. Students may be placed in either Dublin, Galway, or Cork depending on the best internship placement for their field of study. On the ground support and cultural activities will be provided for students in both locations.

LOCATION

Blending a high-energy, multinational professional culture with traditional Irish warmth and hospitality, Dublin has sprawling parks, quirky restaurants, and music and theatre by night. Galway, a city where history and modernity unite, is best known for its brightly colored cafes and pubs, eclectic street performers, and closeness to the famous Cliffs of Moher. Cork is a liberal, youthful, and cosmopolitan city, with spruced-up streets, stretches of waterfront, and an artisan coffee bar on every corner. As the second largest city in Ireland, Cork is well known for its stunning English market, the picturesque river confluence with historical castles and churches, and as a center for budget-friendly traditional food and drink. It is a short distance to the world-famous Blarney stone and Ring of Kerry showcasing the natural beauty of Ireland.

HOUSING

Students will stay in a student residence in Dublin, Galway, or Cork, with en-suite rooms and a shared kitchen and sitting room.
