PROGRAM

This study abroad program will immerse students in the trends and traditions of Morocco regarding water use and other sustainability challenges. The course will prompt a critical, systems-based thought process regarding leadership toward solutions and innovations to address complex, adaptive challenges faced by Moroccan communities and cities. Additionally, students will learn from and speak to both indigenous leaders and sustainable development leaders within the Moroccan context - one of the world's most water-stressed countries according to the World Bank yet also a developing leader in sustainable innovation applications.

LOCATION

This program will travel throughout the southern part of Morocco, beginning and ending in Marrakech. Along the way, there will be travels through Kalaat M'Gouna, Merzouga, and Agadir.

EXCURSIONS

Our excursions will shed light on the traditions and trends adopted by Moroccan communities as it relates to water and sustainability. Some key points of interest include the UNESCO World Heritage site of Ait Ben Haddou; participating in the rose harvest in the Valley of Roses; El Mansour Eddabhi dam; Atlas Film Studios; Nour Solar Complex; hiking in the Atlas Mountains to visit nomadic famillies; Khattarat (an ancient irrigation system); Souk el Had; a camel trek with an overnight desert camp experience; and more!

HOUSING

Accommodation will be in hotels/riads in the different locations.


COURSE INFORMATION
