PROGRAM

This program provides a distinctive exploration of Spanish culture through the lens of cultural assets and their influence on community identity, sustainable development, and the dynamics of preserving cultural traditions and practices. This 5-week study abroad program examines the conceptualization of communities and the different forms of community capital, including human, social, physical, financial, environmental, political, and cultural capital. Students consider how these forms of capital contribute to sustainable development and community well-being. The curriculum integrates Spanish case studies, drawing on the country's rich cultural diversity in food, music, arts, and traditions. It also examines cultural nuances of Spanish society, including eating patterns and behaviors, cuisine and diet, language, family dynamics, Mediterranean time culture, and the social organization of time. Students analyze how cultural heritage and community capitals intersect with institutions, policies, and broader national and international development goals.

LOCATION

The program is based in Sevilla, with multi-day field trips to Madrid and Granada, and day visits to Córdoba and Cádiz.

EXCURSIONS

Program excursions in will include the Madrid Royal Palace, the Elcano Institute (a foreign policy think tank), the Prado Museum, the Seville Cathedral and Giralda Tower, a Spanish cuisine cooking class, Royal Alcázar palace and gardens, a Flamenco dance class and performance, the Alhambra Palace in Grenada, a Fajaluza pottery workshop, Mosque–Cathedral of Córdoba, a walking tour of Cádiz, and so much more!

HOUSING

In Seville, students will stay in shared rooms at a studio residence. During excursions to Madrid and Granada, students will stay in shared rooms at hotels.

- Open to all majors
- Minimum 2.5 GPA
- Must be in good standing
- Students will be required to submit a resume, statement of purpose, and two references during their application, as well as interview with the program directors

2026 PRICING

Undergraduate Program Fee: \$9,098

A \$395 nonrefundable deposit toward the total cost of the program is due at the time of application. The remaining fees are due no later than 45 days prior to departure. If you receive financial aid, you can defer payment until it disburses. Deferment decisions will be based on the amount of aid to be received.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Tuition for 6 UF credits, housing, some meals, in-country transportation, program excursions and cultural activities, international health insurance, and emergency medical assistance.

WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED

Round-trip airfare, most meals, additional personal travel, and personal expenses

UFIC offers many study abroad scholarships, with various eligibility criteria. The Summer 2026 scholarship deadline is March 1, 2026. Apply on our website!








